



LILIESLEAF FARM OPERATIONAL SINCE 2022

1. **LILIESLEAF IS NOT CLOSED.** The site did experience a temporary closure during the COVID-19 period, as many heritage institutions did, but it has been reopened and operational since 2022.
2. While, like many heritage organisations, Liliesleaf continues to face financial pressures and is actively working to secure sustainable funding, the Trust has ensured that operations, conservation, and public programmes remain ongoing.
3. Liliesleaf remains open to the public, engaged in educational outreach, and committed to its mission of preserving South Africa's liberation heritage while evolving into a Dialogue Centre for peace and reconciliation.
4. Looking ahead, our plans are centred on strengthening Liliesleaf's role as a Dialogue Centre for peace and reconciliation, expanding educational outreach, and deepening partnerships with schools, municipalities, and tourism operators. Conservation of collections and archives remains a priority, alongside compliance with heritage and labour legislation to safeguard both the site and its staff.
5. We are also actively pursuing sustainable funding and donor support to secure long-term resilience, while rolling out inclusive programmes that reconnect Liliesleaf with communities and visitors. In this way, Liliesleaf is not only preserving its historic legacy but also evolving into a platform for dialogue, nation-building, and global engagement.
6. Liliesleaf remains a site of profound national and international significance, central to South Africa's liberation heritage and the global struggle for human rights
